It follows on from our successful first course held in February this year.

This hands-on training includes professional course notes and training by **Dr Kuldip Sidhu**, who undertook advanced training in hESC cell culturing at WiCell in Wisconsin. The course is available for groups of up to 6 people. Tissue culture experience is a prerequisite. The cost is \$1,500 / person (GST exclusive).
